Every volunteer, spouse and dependents are provided with a nominal amount of **life insurance.**

Interested candidates must:

- a) Have an Ontario Secondary School Diploma or equivalent;
- b) Be at least 18 years of age;
- c) Live full-time in the Town of Fort Erie;
- d) Be self-confident, reliable and understand the importance of team work and cooperation;
- e) Have the ability to read, understand and apply technical procedures and guidelines;
- f) Possess a valid unrestricted Class "G" drivers' license; and
- Provide a satisfactory police background check and medical physical evaluation.



How do I become a Volunteer Firefighter?



Step1: Complete an application which will be reviewed to take the process further.



Step2: Submission of Documents including Certificate of medical fitness and certificate from Niagara Regional Police.



Step 3: Complete a physical fitness test and the recruit training.



Step 4: Post a successful training begins a 12– month probationary with other evaluations.
